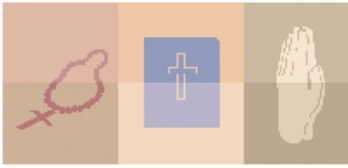

### Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

While the gospels of Matthew and Luke begin with lengthy descriptions of the first days of Jesus' life, Mark plunges the reader into the actions and challenging deeds of the adult Jesus right from the beginning. Notice that today's gospel reading is in the very first chapter of the gospel. At this point in Matthew, we haven't yet had the birth of Jesus, and in Luke at this point, the angel has not even come to bring his message to Mary!

In Mark, this first chapter is packed with events that come one after another in rapid succession. Here, Jesus and his disciples are in Capernaum, and all are surprised by Jesus' teaching and by the authority of his message.

In the Gospel of Mark, Jesus is intent on keeping his identity as Messiah secret, yet in the first half of the gospel, the author puts recognition on the lips of demons and those who are possessed. It is an unclean spirit who says "I know who you are," not one of the disciples. Jesus again advocates silence (1:25).

In the reading from Deuteronomy, the Lord says, "I will raise up a prophet" (18:18). The gospel makes it clear that for Christians, this prophet raised up is Jesus of Nazareth. Deuteronomy says that the Lord will put the words in the mouth of this messenger, and that these words must be heeded (18:19). The prophet of the Lord will be one whose message is powerful. Such authority is emphasized by Mark in this story, for statements about the authority of Jesus frame the short story in verse 22 and then in verse 27; the exorcism, an action, is framed by a message about the power in Jesus' teaching.

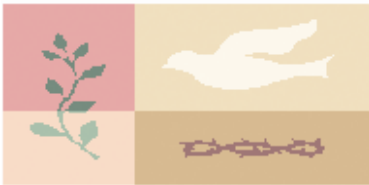

#### Automated Giving is the "New Checkbook" ... Sign Up Now!

In the 1950s, many parishioners took advantage of that era's technology by putting checks, rather than cash, in their Sunday envelopes. Today, checks are becoming a thing of the past for many of us, who are paying bills online and having automatic deductions made from bank accounts.

You can add St. Daniel Parish to your list of automated checks by signing up with your bank. You only need to make a simple online arrangement through your bank for automated weekly or monthly mail-in donations to the parish Stewardship Office.
