Wishing you all the best in the New Year. Our year starts off with one of our largest events fundraiser opportunities during the year, the Auto Show Coat Check. We were asked to partner with our Brother Knights from Davisburg last year and it ended up raising almost \$6000 for our council. They have invited us to participate again this year, which is a great opportunity for us.

It will come as no surprise to you that our council could greatly benefit from having another successful program this year in doing the coat check. For that to happen, we need your help.

The Building Corporation has interviewed a handful of real estate brokers to handle the listing of our Knights of Columbus Council Hall for sale. We reported in the December newsletter that after long and deliberate review we have come to the conclusion that with declining council revenues we can no longer afford to run our Council Hall. After reviewing a handful of proposals from brokers, we have listed our hall for sale with Signature Associates.

The Building Corporation will continue to run Bingo, rent the hall for events such as weddings and to run Fish Fry Dinners to keep revenue coming in. We will continue to pay necessary expenses to keep the building running.

Anyone interested in finding out what is going on with this is welcome to attend our Building Corporation meetings. These take place at 6PM on the first Thursday of each month.

## **Ladies Auxiliary – January 2012**

I have a favorite expression that keeps things in perspective for me. I have to admit that I hadn't heard it until it was uttered by Dr. Phil; I'm sure it's been around a lot longer, though! It goes like this: "The definition of insanity is doing the same thing over and over again and expecting different results." Well, like most people, I have fallen victim to this behavior pattern on more than one occasion! But at least now I try to be more aware of it and act on it before it gets out of hand. Life is too short to waste time on things that don't help others, or that can't produce something positive, such as a profit to be given to charity, or at the very least, a good feeling of knowing you did the best job you could in every situation. This change was needed due to the increase in food costs and to eliminate financial losses sustained by the Auxiliary in the past year. However after further discussion between the bingo committees, it was decided that there would be an increase to the amount of money given to the Auxiliary to pay for workers' food from the bingo earnings. So as of right now, there will be no changes for bingo workers regarding their food.

For those who may not be aware, these losses have directly affected our ability to give to worthy charitable causes and to assist the Knights with their financial obligations as we much as we have in the past, since bingo kitchen revenues are our only source of fundraising. This past Christmas, for example, we were only able to give 25% of what we have in years past to groups such as Be a Santa to a Senior, a program that provides area senior citizens with items from their wish list...a lot of these lists have only the most basic of needs on them, such as stamps, socks, even toilet paper! The economy has made it difficult for everyone, and we are no exception.

At our annual Ladies Auxiliary Christmas party, we had a wonderful time sharing our best dishes during the potluck dinner, and our blind auction raised \$460 for charity! I would like to thank the twenty-two ladies that attended this year's party for being so generous in your bids as well as your cooking! Everything was delicious, and we had a lot of fun and competition with the "high stakes" bidding that took place. At our next meeting on Monday, January 9<sup>th</sup>, we will begin at 6 p.m. with snacks and social time (bring an appetizer or dessert to share), then the business meeting will begin at 7 p.m., where one of the items we will discuss will be the recipient of our auction money. Come have some fun, and voice your opinion on where the money should go! New faces are always welcome; come to a meeting or two, *then* decide if you want to join! Remember, ladies, we are part of the Knights...by joining the Auxiliary, you are helping not only the ladies' group, but our Knights as well. Everything we do is to improve and sustain our council, as well as our community and church. I can't express how important your role is as a supporter of the Knights of Columbus. It is an association to be proud to be a part of.

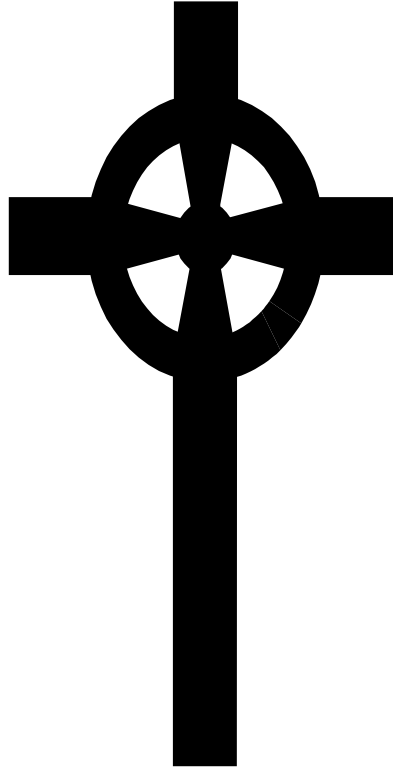

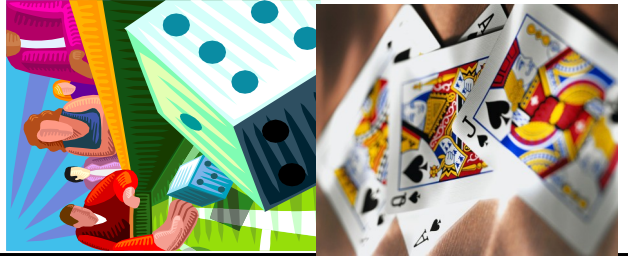

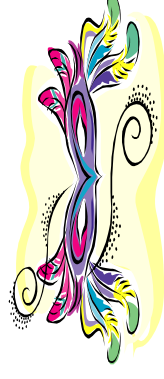

8. Organize a diaper drive for your local Pregnancy Resource Center. Contact your local CPC to see if anyone is already doing a drive you can join in on, and if not, volunteer to do one yourself. 7. Educate yourself on all aspects of the pro-life movement. One important thing you can do is sign up for e-mail updates from your favorite pro-life organizations on most of their websites. Each organization has different information, so it pays to sign up for a few and just read what you can. There are also great educational resources online at [priestsforlife.org](http://priestsforlife.org), [standtrue.com](http://standtrue.com), [hh76.com](http://hh76.com), and [abort73.com](http://abort73.com).

6. Wear pro-life t-shirts and clothing. You can reach thousands of people a day wearing a pro-life t-shirt. My favorite place to wear mine is the airport; I think I get maximum visibility there. School is also a great place to wear a pro-life t-shirt – if your school gives you trouble, you can always contact the Alliance Defense Fund at 1-800-tell-adf. You can order great pro-life t-shirts at Pro-life World: [www.prolifeworld.com](http://www.prolifeworld.com)

5. Donate regularly to a pro-life organization of your choice; these organizations operate solely from generous donations from people like you. There are many great organizations that I can list that deserve your support, but seeming as I work for Priests for Life and Stand True I will suggest these two. Simply go to [priestsforlife.org](http://priestsforlife.org) or [standtrue.org](http://standtrue.org) and make an online donation, or find out how to get on their mailing lists.

4. Volunteer at your local Pregnancy Resource Center or Home for Unwed Mothers. These ministries always need help – whether it is answering phones, cleaning, yard work, or other duties. Look up Abortion Alternatives in the phone book.

3. Distribute pro-life literature wherever you go. It is important that we are always prepared to present a knowledgeable and strong pro-life message at any time. I suggest visiting sites like [priestsforlife.org](http://priestsforlife.org) and [hh76.org](http://hh76.org), and ordering pro-life literature to keep with you at all times.

2. Sidewalk counseling is one of the most effective ways of outreach in saving unborn children. Being in front of the abortion clinic and standing in the gap for the children is vital, and has proven to save countless lives. 
